Introducing Kagoshima's — No. 1 products in Japan, nurtured by tradition and nature.

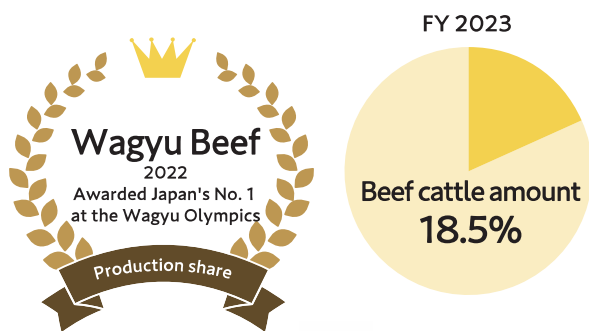

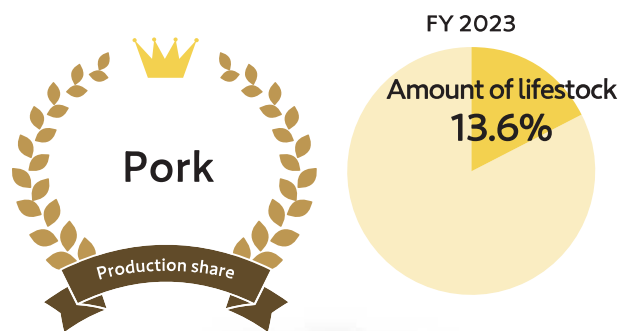
